Statement of Faith

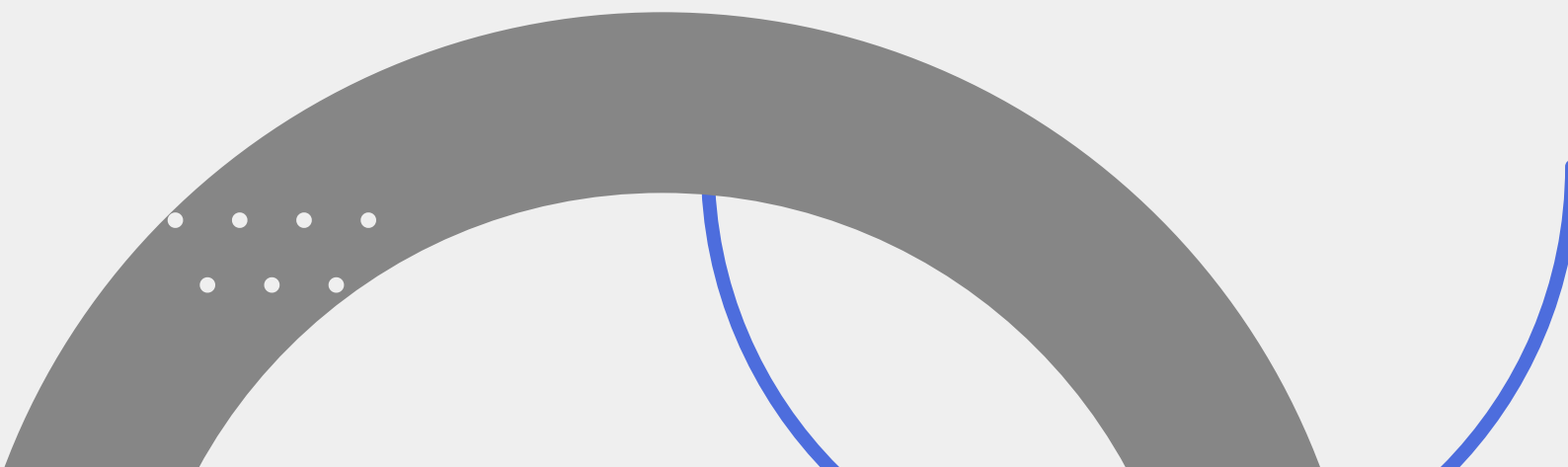

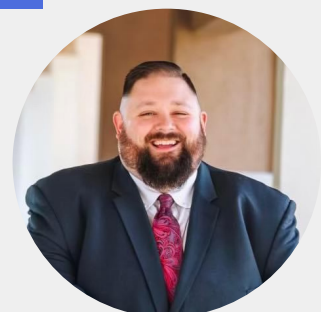

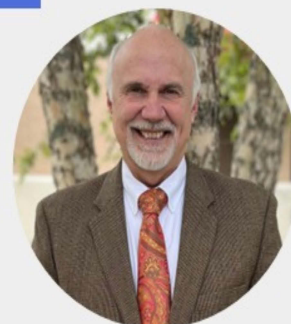

Entrance Requirements:

Students who have successfully graduated from high school or earned a GED may apply for admission at Carolina Bible College. Pastor recommendation and transcripts will be required before a student will be permitted to enroll. SAT or ACT testing scores are not required but are encouraged.

Admissions Procedure:

1. Email or call the office for an application packet or download application form from our website.
2. Complete all forms in the application packets. You may email the forms to our office or send through postal mail.
3. Pastor Recommendation, written Salvation testimonies, and transcripts must be received in the admissions office prior to consideration. (Students with ANY higher education must send in a transcript.)

Admissions



Classes at Carolina Bible College are on an eight semester rotation. It is designed to be like a circle. Wherever you jump in on the circle, you complete your circle to complete the degree. (A half circle would be completed for an associates degree.)

** Classes are subject to change at the discretion of the college administration**

The first number in a course number indicates what year the class falls during the four year design (1-4).

The second and third number in the course number indicates the order that class falls within a year in each class category. (example: BI 101 is the first Bible category class that falls within the first year.)

The Academics

of Carolina Bible College

Pastoral Theology

This bachelor degree program is for men who have been called of God to preach. These classes will train preachers on how to preach different types of sermons, Bible doctrines, church management, basic counseling and many other areas.



Christian Ministries

This degree is offered as an associates or a bachelors. This program is for men and women who have been called and have the desire to serve the Lord and to learn more about Him. Students will learn Bible principles, church management, and many other area of study.

Christian Education

This bachelor program is designed to train teachers how to teach the future generation in a Christian environment. They are taught how to incorporate Biblical principles into each of their lessons. These students will also have opportunities to put their learning in to action.

Christian Counseling

This bachelor program will train students on how to handle many different situations they may encounter in a counseling session. While there are parts of secular psychology that must be learned and discussed, these students will learn how to recognize the root spiritual problem and how to properly counsel with Christ at the forefront.

Reasons for Dismissal

1. A student who becomes vocally non-compliant with the benefits of Temple Baptist Church and Carolina Bible College.
2. A student who has more than two unexcused absences during a semester term. (Ministry related absences will not count towards absences, but MUST be approved by administration beforehand.)
3. A student caught cheating will be dismissed for the school term. The student will be allowed to return the next term after a decision by the governing body allows them to return. If a student repeats the offence, they will not be dismissed permanently.
4. A student who fails to pay tuition up-to-date within one month after mid-term or final exam will be dismissed until payment is up-to-date.
5. A full-time student whose GPA falls below 1.0.
6. A student who is non-compliant with the standards of conduct at Carolina Bible College.
